



Every third Sunday from September 16th, 2018 to February 17th, 2019, a Shamisen of Nagauta workshop will be held at the Asakusa Culture Tourist Information Center. Nagauta is a traditional Japanese type of music that developed as Kabuki music, but it can also be enjoyed with Shamisen music. The program will offer guests an impressive performance by professional musicians and give participants an opportunity to experience playing a Shamisen.
