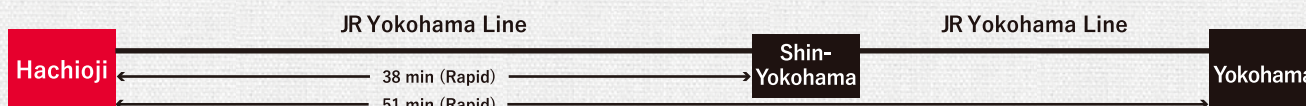

◆Koryu Nishikawa the Fifth of the Nishikawa Koryu Troupe for Hachioji Kuruma Ningyo

Mr. Nishikawa learned the art of puppetry from his grandfather (the Third) and his father (the Fourth). He has also studied three-person Bunraku puppeteering as an apprentice at the age of 23, and performed in many cities across Japan in addition to regularly-scheduled performance in his hometown Hachioji. Mr. Nishikawa is often invited abroad for his art, and has performed in various countries.

◆Sekkyobushi no Kai

Wakatayu Satsuma the First created Satsuma-style sekkyobushi (sermon ballads) in Edo during the Kansei era (1789-1801). The style gained popularity when it spread to the outskirts of Edo in the last days of the Tokugawa shogunate, and Hachioji's own Wakatayu Satsuma the Tenth (Soshuku Uchida) was well-known during the Taisho and Showa eras. The Sekkyobushi no Kai was established in 1986 to preserve and pass down the art of Satsuma-style sermon ballads, improve performance techniques, and conduct studies and research. In 1995, it was designated as an Organization for the Preservation of Intangible Cultural Properties by the Tokyo Metropolitan government.

These hangyoku (apprentice geisha) made their debut last year for the first time in 50 years in Hachioji, known to Tokyoites as a close and familiar geisha quarter. The Hachioji Geigi-shu are also actively expanding their presence in locations outside the tatami room, such as performing geisha roles in the opera "Madame Butterfly" (sponsored by Hachioji College Community & Culture Fureai Foundation) and NHK television dramas.



Satsuma Biwa -Lingering Notes Waft and Fade Away-

◆Yoyo Nagatomo

Ms. Nagatomo performs Satsuma Biwa of the Tsuruda School and is a member of the Japan Biwa Music Association. She became a disciple of biwa music in 1987 and studied under Mr. Kakuyo Yoshinaga. She has been holding an annual concert at Icho Hall since 2000. She also promotes activities at elementary and middle schools as part of efforts to educate on traditional Japanese music, played the biwa for the Yokohama Yumeza theatre troupe's production of "Phoenix," and popularizes the instrument by collaborating with various performance genres such as sword fighting and dancing, recitation, Noh, and Latin music.



Setoka Shishimai -A Folk Dance of Akiruno-

◆Setoka Shishimai Hozonkai

The actual origin of the Setoka Shishimai is unknown, but lion dances were recorded in the ancient texts of Daigyoji Temple in the city of Akiruno over 300 years ago, in the middle of the Edo period (1603 - 1868). The cane-fighting during the lion dance is derived from the famous Tennen Rishin-ryu style used by the Shinsengumi police force towards the end of the Edo period, and taught by the kendo master Seiju Onishi, who opened a dojo in the Ozaki area of Akiruno city. The group is active primarily in Akiruno, in addition to educational activities for understanding traditional culture at Akiruno Shiritsu Tasai Elementary School.



Nakaaihara Hayashiren

-Strong Bonds to a Tiny Town, for People Who Live in the Moment-

◆Nakaaihara Hayashi-ren (Festival Ensemble)

This ensemble began in the first year after World War II as a youth group in the Aiharamachi and Nakaaihara areas in the city of Machida, upon receiving guidance from Otobayashi in the neighboring Oto area. The group was given the name Nakaaihara Hayashi-ren in 1955. The eight songs they will perform are Yatai, Shoden, Kamakura, Kandamaru, Inba, Komori-uta, Shichome, and Shagiri. They are primarily active in festivals, starting with Nakaaihara Sansha Shrine festival, as well as incidental music for activities such as the Suwa Shrine housed in Nakaaihara and functions for nearby facilities. There are 50 members in the ensemble, from children to adults. They give a guidance about musical accompaniment by the slogan "a delightful festival" throughout the year. Last year was the 70th anniversary for the group, and they received recognition for their contribution to arts and culture from the city of Machida.



Hinobayashi Hozonkai

-Edo Festivals are Alive in Hino-

◆Hinobayashi Hozonkai (Festival Ensemble)

Hinobayashi's origins date back 200 years ago, and they will perform seven songs said to be passed on to Hino city: Hashi, Kamakura, Shoden, Miyakamakura, Kuni-katame, Shichome, and Ninba, in a simple style without embellishments. The preservation society was established in 1985 and they focus their performance activities on local festivals and events such as Hino's Yasaka Shrine Festival, Hachioji Festival, and Shinsengumi Festival. By learning and passing on the wonder of Hino's folk performances, together they work towards performing proper festival accompaniment and grow through techniques that teach about Japan's culture, history, and propriety. They also work towards the goal of entertaining their audience, which encourages them to train even more.

◆Hongo High School Japanese Culture Club

Hongo Junior and Senior High School is a boys' school in Toshima Ward. Despite assumptions that students at a boys' school have no interest in playing the koto or shamisen, the club has 10 members at present. They receive guidance from an outside teacher three times a week, and practice every day with the goal of performing at the Senior High School Cultural Federation Central Tournament. In July, they appeared in a mini-concert organized by a master teacher. They will also perform for the "Sugamo Collection" planned to be held inside their school in October, so everyone is practicing with delight.

◆Musashino Joshigakuin Junior and High School Koto Club

This girls' school was established in Nishitokyo City in 1924, but starting from next year, the school's name will be changed to Musashino University Junior and High School due to a coeducation plan. The school's koto club was established in 1962, and its members perform a wide variety of tunes on the koto and shamisen, from original koto compositions to pop songs. In addition to the school's cultural festival, they also perform at locations outside school, such as elder care facilities.

This school is located nearby the Kurome River, which was selected as one of the "100 Notable Water Sites of the Heisei Period" by the government; the rich natural environment encourages students' studies and club activities. At this concert, the club members will challenge themselves by playing couple of well-known anime tunes and a song "Kinutasansho" composed by famous koto player Tadao Sawai. Go ahead and hum along if you like the songs!

-The Spirit of Tachikawa Hagoromo Town-

◆Tachikawa Hanesan Hayashiren (Festival Ensemble)

The Tachikawa Hanesan Hayashiren is Hagoromocho's only festival ensemble under the Tachikawa Hagoromo Sanchoe Neighborhood Council, and was established in 1976 after training in the Meguro-style of festival ensemble. There are 40 members at present, and with the motto of "Solidarity and Etiquette," they continue to practice without breaks twice a week at the Hagoromocho Sanchoe Neighborhood Council Hall in order to improve their technique. The group performs 10 - 15 times per year, and does their best to get everyone excited during summer festivals. The songs they will perform are Yatai, Kamakura, Kunigatame, Shichome, and Ninba. They are sure to delight attendees with taiko drums beating in harmony with their dancing.



Hachioji Maturibayashi Rengokai

-The Stylish and Gallant Sounds of Summer-

◆Hachioji Maturibayashi Rengokai (Festival Ensemble)

This association was founded in 1994, and 24 organizations have become affiliated over the past 20-something years. From the start, Hachioji has included festival ensembles from neighboring areas, and works to pass on and preserve those regions' traditional festival ensembles. It is said that festival ensembles spread during the Edo period (1608-1868), because they were used by Shinto priests to nurture the youth in the low-lying areas of Edo (Tokyo). The Hachioji Maturibayashi Rengokai also works towards mutual study of festival ensembles as a way to teach children to cherish their birthplace, and a desire for their sound upbringing.



Tied to Ancient Roads The Story of Hachioji

— Did you know Hachioji has a collection of historical roads no longer used today? In the Jomon era (14,000 – 300 BC), it served as an important place for exchange between mountain and sea folk. —

Shapes of Hachioji's past not widely known and the story of the many paths walked by our ancestors will be told through an original Legendary Tamatebako stage performance.

Nishi-hoshasen U-Road is the road which runs obliquely towards the station through the vertically divided town along the Koshu Kaido route. The Yaen Kaido route starting from the side of the Yokoyamacho Post Office on Koshu Kaido route also crosses this U-Road. The vestiges of the Showa period in our town will be explored using jinrikisha ("rickshaws") to follow the path of local history. Search for traces of history in the calligraphy of store signposts along this route.
