Traditional Japanese paper cutting is an improvised art which a performer creates only by a sheet of paper and scissors, according to audience's requests. In this program, you will cut the paper based on some themes. You can take the paper cutout home after you finish it.

Kyokugei



Kyokugei is a traditional Japanese performing art. You can see the kasamawashi performance which means rotating an umbrella with some objects, as well as gokai-jawan, using a long rod to support some objects on top of the rod.

In Japan, the kasamawashi is particularly popular and also believed to be very auspicious.

You can try performances such as kasamawashi and kamitate (a part of gokai-jawan).

Wazuma

Wazuma is traditional magic that has been handed down from ancient Japan.


This magic was extremely popular among the masses in the Edo period.
