

Arts Council Tokyo Traditional Culture Program Decision to hold new traditional culture experience program for foreigners in 2016

Last year, more than 28,000 foreign visitors participated from all over the world. This year, new programs will be held in August/October.

The release of the "Arts Council Tokyo Announces FY 2016 Line up of Traditional Culture Programs" was announced on April 26th, 2016. This time we inform you of the additional short programs that offer foreign visitors the opportunity to gain first-hand experience of traditional culture and performing arts around tourist attractions in Tokyo.

The program began in 2015, and had more than 28,000 participants during the last year. In addition to the "Japanese dance workshop" at the Asakusa Culture Tourist Information Center and the "Engei workshop" at the Edo-Tokyo Museum already underway almost every weekend, newly scheduled events include an "Edo-style Hand Painted Paper Lanterns workshop" and "Edo Sudare Coaster workshop" at the MOSHI MOSHI BOX Harajuku Tourist Information Center on August 20th (Sat) and 21st (Sun), a "Go" workshop at the Asakusa Culture Tourist Information Center on August 28th (Sun) and a "Tokyo kumihimo (braided cords) workshop", "Kimono dressing workshop" and "Japanese flower arrangement workshop" at the Hama-rikyu Gardens on October 15th (Sat) and 16th (Sun). All programs are conducted with explanations in English. We welcome you to visit these programs and cover them in the media.

3. Outdoor Booths in Hama-rikyu Gardens

(Open the Same Day as the Tokyo Grand Tea Ceremony 2016)

The workshops of Tokyo Kumihimo (braided cords), Kimono dressing and Japanese flower arrangement will be held at the Hama-rikyu Gardens, the Tokyo Grand Tea Ceremony 2016 venue. This is a valuable opportunity to come in contact with traditional culture in the middle of a Japanese garden well-known as a "metropolitan oasis." Reception for participation will be open at the venue on that day, so feel free to come.

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Program	Tokyo Kumihimo (braided cords) workshop
Content	A brief explanation on Tokyo Kumihimo (braided cords) will be given, and a workshop allowing you to create a Kumihimo by hand will be held. Participants will braid Kumihimo by hand using two different colors of silk thread. The braids may be taken home after completed as bracelets, etc. A demonstration on Kumihimo using a braiding stand will also be given at the same time.
